## What did John say?

- For a full generation, the church had been ferociously persecuted
  - Nero (AD 54-68)
  - Domitian (AC 81-96)

## Even their Spiritual Parents!

- In AD 90, Judaism kicked Christians out of their first spiritual "home.
  - This was an emotional blow

This was also a huge political blow

## Key Interpretation Principle

• Before we can know what a Bible passage says to us, we must know what it said to the original readers.

"I lift up my eyes to the hills. From where does my help come" (Psalm 121:1, ESV)?

#### What the First Readers Saw

- Jesus!
  - (Chapters 1-5)
- Their great pain while humans rule
  - (Chapters 6-18)
- Their great joy when Jesus' rule is complete
  - (Chapters 19-22)

#### Details

 John was forbidden to write against the empire.

- His solution? Use symbols that only his readers would understand.
  - He may have been TOO successful ©

 There are remarkable parallels between Genesis 1-2 and Revelation 21-22

Genesis	Revelation
Division of light and darkness ( Gen. 1:4).	No night there (Rev. Rev. 21:25+).
Division of land and sea ( Gen. 1:10).	No more sea (Rev. Rev. 21:1+).
Rule of sun and moon (Gen. 1:16).	No need of sun or moon (Rev. Rev. 21:23+).
First heavens and earth finished (Gen Gen. 2:1-3).	New heaven and earth forever (Rev. Rev. 21:2+).
Humans in a prepared garden (Gen. <u>Gen. 2:8-9</u> ).	Humans in a prepared city (Rev. Rev. 21:2+).

Genesis	Revelation
River flowing out of Eden (Gen. <u>Gen. 2:10</u> ).	River flowing from God's throne (Rev. Rev. 22:1+).
Tree of life in the midst of the garden (Gen. <u>Gen. 2:9</u> ).	Tree of life throughout the city (Rev. Rev. 22:2+).
God walking in the garden (Gen. <u>Gen. 3:8</u> ).	God dwelling with His people (Rev. Rev. 21:3+).
Bride formed for her husband (Gen. <u>Gen. 2:21-23</u> ).	Bride adorned for her husband (Rev. Rev. 21:2+).
